In an effort to further this encouragement and development, Full Sail University introduces the Academic Advantage Scholarship Program.





ACADEMIC ADVANTAGE SCHOLARSHIP

AWARDS

Academic Advantage Scholarship for eligible campus degree program candidates will vary:

- Associate's degree students may earn up to \$5,000 for their first academic year, and a total of \$7,500 for all academic years.
- Bachelor's degree students may earn up to \$6,000 for their first academic year, and a total of \$15,000 for all academic years.
- Master's degree students may earn up to \$4,000 for their first academic year, and a total of \$6,000 for all academic years.

Applicants are able to meet eligibility each Full Sail academic year based on academic performance as outlined below.

MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

In order to be eligible for consideration, those applying for a Academic Advantage Scholarship must:

- Complete and submit this application and transcripts or test scores as applicable (see next) prior to first day of class
- Applicants who do not meet first academic year eligibility may still apply and be eligible for an award in a future academic year based on their Full Sail University GPA

Undergraduate degree program applicants may:

- Receive an award in their first academic year if they have earned at least one of the following: a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale in their secondary or postsecondary education (minimum of 30 semester credits); an SAT score of 840 or higher; an SAT score prior to 2016 of 1120 or higher; or an ACT score of 17 or higher
- Receive an award in any subsequent academic year if their Full Sail University cumulative GPA is 2.5 or higher

Graduate degree program applicants may:

- Receive an award in their first academic year if they have earned at least one of the following: a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale in their secondary or postsecondary education (minimum of 30 semester credits); an SAT score of 927 or higher; an SAT score prior to 2016 of 1250 or higher; or an ACT score of 19 or higher
- Receive an award in a subsequent academic year if their Full Sail University cumulative GPA is 3.0 or higher

HOW TO APPLY

- Read the application thoroughly and complete the required information below.
- As applicable, submit high school or postsecondary transcripts with final GPA, SAT score, or ACT score prior to the first day of class. Your Full Sail Enrollment Guide can provide additional information on submission of these items.

AWARD DETERMINATION

- Applicant's high school or postsecondary transcripts, SAT score, or ACT score will be evaluated to determine eligibility for the first academic year award amount. Applicants do not have to be eligible for the first academic year award in order to be awarded in subsequent academic years.
- Recipients will be notified by the Financial Aid department prior to beginning each academic year, provided the eligibility requirements above are met.

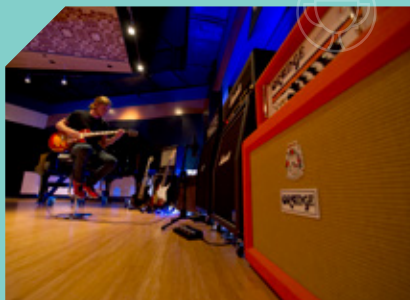
- Applicant must be a first-time student and have applied for a Full Sail University campus degree program.
- A change of degree program, interruption of training, or withdrawal may result in cancellation of scholarship award and disbursement. Student understands that a change of student status may impact eligibility.
- Scholarship funds will be disbursed by semester throughout the student's enrollment at Full Sail University.
- Funds from the Academic Advantage Scholarship may only be used toward the tuition of a Full Sail University campus degree program.
- The Academic Advantage Scholarship is nontransferable and has no redeemable cash value.
- The Academic Advantage Scholarship may be combined with most Full Sail University scholarships; some restrictions apply.
- Financial aid is available for those who qualify.

CREATIVE MINDS

SCHOLARSHIP

MISSION STATEMENT

The Creative Minds Scholarship is designed to identify high school seniors who are exceptionally talented in their written and visual communication, academically successful, and passionate about careers in entertainment, media, and technology. Through the Creative Minds Scholarship program, eligible campus-based Bachelor of Science and Bachelor of Fine Arts program participants may receive up to \$25,000 toward the tuition of most of Full Sail University's campus-based degree programs.





CREATIVE MINDS SCHOLARSHIP

AWARDS

The Creative Minds Scholarship program will award up to \$25,000 to eligible high school seniors pursuing Full Sail University campus degree programs. This scholarship fund is limited and will be awarded to all applicants who meet the eligibility requirements and according to the award determination process as outlined below.

MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for consideration, those applying for the Creative Minds Scholarship must:

- Be a 2024 graduating high school senior earning a standard high school diploma.
- Have earned at least one of the following: a cumulative high school GPA of 3.0 or higher; an SAT score of 927 or higher; an ACT score of 19 or higher.
- Have submitted their Application for Admission by **Monday, March 4, 2024**.
- Have applied for and met the requirements of a Full Sail University 22- or 27-month campus Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Fine Arts degree program.
- Begin their degree program on one of the following start dates: **August 5, September 2, or September 30, 2024**.

- Have completed and submitted the scholarship application, along with an unofficial high school transcript, SAT score, or ACT score, to Full Sail University via the Full Sail One website by **Monday, April 1, 2024**.
- Complete the application and an original 500-word essay answering How Has My Creative Mind Led Me to Full Sail University?

HOW TO APPLY

In order to be eligible for consideration, those applying for the Creative Minds Scholarship must:

- Read the application thoroughly and complete a 500-word essay answering How Has My Creative Mind Led Me to Full Sail University?
- The Creative Minds Scholarship application and essay must be submitted to the Full Sail University Scholarship Committee by **Monday, April 1, 2024**.
- Submit the unofficial high school transcript or SAT/ACT score, if applicable, via the Full Sail One website by **Monday, April 1, 2024**.
- Attach the essay by using the attachment feature and submit the completed scholarship application or: Email CampusEnrollment@fullsail.com

AWARD DETERMINATION

- Applicants' unofficial high school transcript, SAT score, or ACT score will be reviewed by a scholarship committee.
- Applicants' essays will be evaluated by a scholarship committee on the following criteria: originality, composition, clarity, and relevance to the topic. Essays judged outstanding will be awarded.
- Recipients will be notified by the Admissions department prior to beginning their degree program, provided eligibility requirements are met.
- Scholarship amount will be disbursed throughout students' academic years, equally divided between semesters as applicable.

CREATIVE MINDS SCHOLARSHIP

PROVISIONS

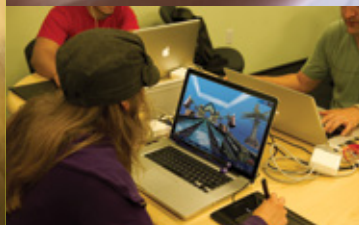
- Applicants must have applied as a new student to Full Sail University for the August 5, September 2, or September 30, 2024 start date.
- Applicants must have met the entrance requirements for the desired Full Sail University 22- or 27-month campus bachelor's degree program.
- Applicants must have completed a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or confirmed cash payments.
- A change of degree program, interruption of training, or withdrawal from degree program may result in cancellation of the scholarship award and disbursements. Student understands that a change of student status may impact eligibility.
- Final award of scholarship is contingent upon receipt of all required Admissions and Financial Aid documents by assigned start date.
- Students who delay their start date as determined by Full Sail University will forfeit their eligibility.
- Funds from the Creative Minds Scholarship may only be used toward the tuition of a Full Sail University 22- or 27-month campus bachelor's degree program.
- This scholarship is nontransferable and has no redeemable cash value.
- All submissions must abide by Full Sail University's Nondiscrimination Policy. Applicants who submit an essay that does not abide by this policy will be disqualified.
- The Creative Minds Scholarship may be combined with most Full Sail University scholarships; some restrictions apply.
- Financial aid is available to those who qualify.

DEDICATION

SCHOLARSHIP

MISSION STATEMENT

The Full Sail Dedication Scholarship is designed to encourage and develop future entertainment, media and technology professionals who demonstrate true dedication to achieving excellence within their chosen career path. Through the Dedication Scholarship, eligible participants may receive \$1,000 toward the tuition of their Full Sail campus degree program. Students may receive up to \$1,000 in additional funding after beginning their education.





DEDICATION SCHOLARSHIP

AWARDS

The Dedication Scholarship will award \$1,000 to eligible campus degree program candidates during their first academic year. Eligible students may be awarded up to \$1,000 in additional Dedication Scholarship in their second academic year. This scholarship fund is limited, and will be awarded to all applicants who meet the eligibility requirements according to the award determination process as outlined below.

MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

In order to be eligible for consideration, those applying for a Dedication Scholarship must:

- Have attended one of Full Sail University's on-campus Behind the Scenes tours prior to and no longer than two years before beginning class; Virtual Behind the Scenes tours attended through April 10, 2022 are also eligible.
- Complete this application and an original 250-word essay on Dedication and My Career Dream. Submit these prior to the first day of class in order to be eligible for a \$1,000 scholarship award for the first academic year.
- Maintain a minimum, cumulative GPA of 2.5 for first academic year for an additional \$500 award.
- Maintain a minimum, cumulative Global Professionalism Standards (GPS) score of 100% for first academic year for an additional \$500 award.

HOW TO APPLY

- The Dedication Scholarship application must be submitted to the Full Sail Scholarship Committee prior to the desired start date.
- To apply for this scholarship, please contact your Admissions Representative at 800.226.7625.

AWARD DETERMINATION

- Applicants' essays will be evaluated by a scholarship committee on the following criteria: originality, composition, clarity, and relevance to the topic. Applicants' documentation will be referenced to verify their date of attendance at and completion of a Behind the Scenes Tour. Upon completion of the first academic year, applicants' GPA and GPS will be referenced for eligibility to receive subsequent awards as applicable.
- Recipients will be notified by the Full Sail University Admissions Department prior to beginning their degree program, provided eligibility requirements above are met. Active students will be notified by the Academic Success department of any subsequent awards earned.
- The initial \$1,000 scholarship award will be disbursed in the first academic year, divided equally between semesters. The additional \$500 award/s for attaining the prescribed GPA and/or GPS will be disbursed in the last semester of the second academic year, as applicable.

PROVISIONS

- Applicants must have applied for a start date as a new student to Full Sail University.
- Applicants must have applied for a Full Sail University campus degree program.
- A change of degree program, interruption of training, or withdrawal may result in cancellation of scholarship award and disbursement. Student understands that a change of student status may impact eligibility.
- The Dedication Scholarship may be combined with most Full Sail University scholarship programs. Some restrictions apply.
- Funds from the Dedication Scholarship may be used only toward the tuition of a Full Sail campus degree program.
- The scholarship is nontransferable and has no redeemable cash value.
- Financial aid is available for those who qualify.
- SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS ARE LIMITED AND WILL REMAIN AVAILABLE UNTIL DEPLETED.

EMERGING TECHNOLOGY SCHOLARSHIP

MISSION STATEMENT

The Emerging Technology Scholarship is designed to identify individuals who are exceptionally talented in their problem-solving and critical thinking skills, academically successful, and passionate about emerging technology industries. Through this program, students will receive a full scholarship for select campus or online Bachelor of Science degree programs.



EMERGING TECHNOLOGY SCHOLARSHIP

AWARDS

The Emerging Technology Scholarship program will award a full scholarship including tuition and a laptop to eligible applicants pursuing select Full Sail University degree programs. Applicants will need to adhere to the eligibility criteria and strict deadlines outlined in the Minimum Eligibility Requirements and Application Process sections. Finalists will be invited to a Full Sail University virtual event to participate in a whiteboard problem-solving competition. A very limited number of scholarships awarded to the finalists selected from the competition.

MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for consideration, those applying for the Emerging Technology Scholarship must:

- Meet Admissions requirements for an eligible Bachelor of Science degree program: Computer Science, Cybersecurity, Game Development, Information Technology, Simulation & Visualization, or Web Development.
- Have earned at least one of the following: a cumulative high school GPA of 3.8 or higher, an SAT score after February 2016 of 1133 or higher, or an ACT score of 25 or higher when the scholarship application is submitted.

- Submit an Application for Admission by June 22, 2024.
- Submit an original project with screencast per instructions in the Application Process section by June 22, 2024.
- Begin their degree program within two years of the selection for the scholarships.
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress and adhere to Full Sail University's Code of Conduct.

APPLICATION PROCESS

All eligible candidates will go through the following process:

ROUND 1

- Candidates will submit an original project with screencast based on their degree program of interest by Saturday, June 22, 2024.
See Project Requirements for Applicants section for project requirements. The link to the project and screencast must be submitted to <https://go.fullsail.edu/emerging-technology-scholarship>.
- Candidates will be interviewed by a Full Sail University Admissions representative and apply for admission by Saturday, June 22, 2024.
- Candidates who meet the eligibility requirements for Round 1 will be notified by Monday, June 24, 2022 of eligibility to participate in Round 2 as semifinalists.

ROUND 2

- Upon Round 2 notification, semifinalists will submit a completed scholarship application, a copy of their high school transcript, and an official SAT or ACT score via the student Full Sail One website by Wednesday, June 26, 2024.
- Semifinalists who submit an original project that meets eligibility criteria and possess a high school GPA of 3.8, an SAT score of 1133, or an ACT score of 25 and above will qualify for Finalist status.
- Finalists will be notified by Friday, June 28, 2024 regarding their eligibility to participate in Round 3, the whiteboard problem-solving competition held virtually by Full Sail University.

ROUND 3

- Finalists will be invited to participate in a whiteboard problem-solving competition on Saturday, July 13, 2024. Finalists will receive detailed instructions prior to the event.
- Based on the criteria given, scholarship awards will be announced by Thursday, July 18, 2024.



EMERGING TECHNOLOGY SCHOLARSHIP

AWARD DETERMINATION

- Scholarship applicants eligible for Round 2 will be determined by the Emerging Technology Scholarship panel based on the evaluation of the project submitted for the degree program of interest as listed in the Project Requirements for Applications section, provided all eligibility requirements above are still met.
- Scholarship applicants eligible for Round 3 will be determined based on (1) their high school transcript, SAT score, or ACT score and (2) this scholarship application, provided all eligibility requirements are met. Applicants who have not graduated may submit unofficial transcripts.
- Scholarship recipients will be determined based on the whiteboard problem-solving competition held virtually by Full Sail University.

PROVISIONS & AWARD REQUIREMENTS

- Applicants must have applied as a new student to Full Sail University for a start date within two years of being selected for the scholarship.
 - A change of degree program, interruption of education, or withdrawal from degree program may result in cancellation of the scholarship award and disbursements. Student understands that a change in student status may impact eligibility.
 - Final award of scholarship is contingent upon receipt of all required Admissions and Financial Aid documents by the assigned start date.
 - Students who delay their start date may lose their eligibility.
 - Funds from the Emerging Technology Scholarship may only be used toward the tuition and laptop, known as Project Launchbox, for a Full Sail University campus or online Bachelor of Science degree program.
 - Scholarship funds will be disbursed by semester throughout the student's enrollment at Full Sail University.
- Students must maintain an overall GPA of 3.5 for the duration of their Emerging Technology degree program to remain eligible for scholarship disbursements.
 - This scholarship is nontransferable and has no redeemable cash value.
 - Documentation provided as part of a submission will not be returned.
 - The project must be the original work of the applicant.
 - All submissions must abide by Full Sail University's Nondiscrimination Policy. Applicants who submit work that does not abide by this policy will be disqualified.
 - Work submitted will be judged by Full Sail University's Emerging Technology Scholarship panel.
 - This scholarship cannot be combined with any other scholarships initiated and/or awarded by Full Sail University.
 - Financial aid is available to those who qualify.



EMERGING TECHNOLOGY SCHOLARSHIP

PROJECT REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICANTS

All applicants must select a project listed below and submit an original project, as specified in the instructions below:

CYBERSECURITY

Submit a project plan on how you would protect an information technology server against unauthorized hackers. The plan should include at least one identified system vulnerability, the significance if exploited, and possible steps to protect the system. Also, a screencast explaining the reasoning on how to protect the system must be provided.

COMPUTER SCIENCE

Submit a software application created with a programming language of your choice. The submitted application must show significance and originality and must solve a problem using computer science principles. You must also display significant use of a programming language (e.g., C#, C++, JavaScript, Java). The submission must include all sources and assets used to create the project. Outside sources must be cited within the submission. Submit a brief video (under 10 minutes) that includes the following:

- A screencast/video showcasing your application/site/work and explaining its purpose.

- An explanation of your development process. How did you make this?
- A delineation of what is created and written by you and what is from other sources such as content, code, libraries, group work, frameworks, etc. The objective is to distinguish your original contributions to the project from outside sources.

ELECTRONIC ENGINEERING

Submit an original project creating a vehicle controlled by an external input device using an Arduino board or equivalent. You must use a game engine (e.g., Unity or Unreal) to program your vehicle. The submitted project must include an original STL file of the vehicle being controlled. The submission must include all sources and assets used to create the game. Outside sources must be cited within the submission. Submissions must be under 75 MB and submitted as a complete project in ZIP format. Also, a screencast explaining the project and its features must be provided.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

Submit a project plan on how you integrated a new technology in your home network or lab. Describe what you intended to accomplish, the software or hardware you used, and the results of your project. The plan should include a design of your network, servers, operating systems used, and a screencast of you demonstrating and explaining the working system.

TECHNOLOGY ASSISTANCE

SCHOLARSHIP

MISSION STATEMENT

To demonstrate our commitment, Full Sail University introduces the Technology Assistance Scholarship program. This program is designed to offer assistance to qualified individuals passionate about a career in the entertainment media industry.





TECHNOLOGY ASSISTANCE SCHOLARSHIP

AWARDS

The Technology Assistance Scholarship program will award up to \$2,000 to eligible candidates.

MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

In order to be eligible for consideration, those applying for a Technology Assistance Scholarship must:

- Have conducted an entrance interview with their Full Sail Admissions Representative.
- Have applied for admission to Full Sail University for an online undergraduate degree program.
- Have met the entrance requirements for an eligible Full Sail University online degree program.
- Achieve Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) at the end of the first semester of their Full Sail degree program and be an active full-time student.

HOW TO APPLY

- The Technology Assistance Scholarship application must be submitted to the Full Sail Scholarship Committee at least one week prior to the desired start date.
- To apply for this scholarship, please contact your admissions representative at 800.226.7625.

AWARD DETERMINATION

- Full Sail University will reference SAP at the end of the student's first semester to confirm eligibility.
- Scholarship will be disbursed in either the first or second academic year based upon the student's degree program.

PROVISIONS

- A change of degree program, interruption of training, or withdrawal may result in cancellation of scholarship award and disbursement(s). Student understands that a change of student status may impact eligibility.
- The Technology Assistance Scholarship may be used in conjunction with other Full Sail University scholarships for which student is eligible.
- Funds from the Technology Assistance Scholarship may be used only toward the tuition of eligible online Full Sail undergraduate degree programs.
- The scholarship is nontransferable and has no redeemable cash value.
- Financial aid is available for those who qualify.
- SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS ARE LIMITED AND WILL REMAIN AVAILABLE UNTIL DEPLETED.

WOMEN IN TECHNOLOGY SCHOLARSHIP

MISSION STATEMENT

The Women in Technology Scholarship is designed to identify women who are exceptionally talented in their problem-solving and critical thinking skills, academically successful, and passionate about emerging technology industries. Three components encompass this program: scholarship, community and mentorship.





WOMEN IN TECHNOLOGY SCHOLARSHIP

AWARDS

The Women in Technology Scholarship program will award a full scholarship including tuition and a laptop to an eligible woman pursuing a select Full Sail University degree program. Applicants will need to adhere to eligibility criteria and strict deadlines outlined in the Minimum Eligibility Requirements and Application Process sections. Upon starting the program, the recipient is paired with a mentor (female faculty or graduate in a similar field of study), during their time at Full Sail University. Along with a mentor, the award winner will have an opportunity to engage with the community by attending a conference with an emphasis in Women's leadership in technology. Finalists will be invited to a Full Sail University virtual event to participate in a whiteboard problem-solving competition. A very limited number of scholarships awarded to the finalists selected from the competition.

MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for consideration, those applying for the Women in Technology Scholarship must:

- Identify as female.

- Meet Admissions requirements for an eligible Bachelor of Science degree program: Computer Science, Cybersecurity, Game Development, Information Technology, Simulation & Visualization, or Web Development.
- Have earned at least one of the following: a cumulative high school GPA of 3.8 or higher, an SAT score after February 2016 of 1133 or higher, or an ACT score of 25 or higher when the scholarship application is submitted.
- Submit an Application for Admission by June 22, 2024.
- Submit an original project with screencast per instructions in the Application Process section by June 22, 2024.
- Begin their degree program within two years of selection for the scholarship.
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress and adhere to Full Sail University's Code of Conduct.

APPLICATION PROCESS

All eligible candidates will proceed through the following process:

ROUND 1

- Candidates will submit an original project with screencast based on their degree program of interest by Saturday, June 22, 2024. See Project Requirements for Applicants section for project requirements. The link to the project and screencast must be submitted to <https://go.fullsail.edu/women-in-technology-scholarship>.

- Candidates will be interviewed by a Full Sail University Admissions representative and apply for admission by Saturday, June 22, 2024.
- Candidates who meet the eligibility requirements for Round 1 will be notified by Monday, June 24, 2024 of eligibility to participate in Round 2 as semifinalists.

ROUND 2

- Upon Round 2 notification, semifinalists will submit a completed scholarship application, a copy of their high school transcript, and an official SAT or ACT score via the student Full Sail One website by Wednesday, June 26, 2024.
- Semifinalists who submit an original project that meets eligibility criteria and possess a high school GPA of 3.8, an SAT score of 1133, or an ACT score of 25 and above will qualify for Finalist status.
- Finalists will be notified by Friday, June 28, 2024 regarding their eligibility to participate in Round 3, the whiteboard problem solving competition held virtually by Full Sail University.

ROUND 3

- Finalists will be invited to participate in a whiteboard problem-solving competition on Saturday, July 13, 2024. Finalists will receive detailed instructions prior to the event.
- Based on the criteria given, the scholarship award will be announced by Thursday, July 18, 2024.

WOMEN IN TECHNOLOGY SCHOLARSHIP

AWARD DETERMINATION

- Scholarship applicants eligible for Round 2 will be determined by the Women in Technology Scholarship panel based on the evaluation of the project submitted for the degree program of interest as listed in Section G, provided all eligibility requirements above are still met.
- Scholarship applicants eligible for Round 3 will be determined based on (1) their high school transcript, SAT score, or ACT score and (2) this scholarship application, provided all eligibility requirements are met. Applicants who have not graduated may submit unofficial transcripts.
- A scholarship recipient will be determined based on the whiteboard problem-solving competition held virtually by Full Sail University.

PROVISIONS AND AWARD REQUIREMENTS

- A change of degree program, interruption of education, or withdrawal from degree program may result in cancellation of the scholarship award and disbursements. Student understands that a change in student status may impact eligibility.
- Final award of scholarship is contingent upon receipt of all required Admissions and Financial Aid documents by the assigned start date.
- Students who delay their start date may lose their eligibility.

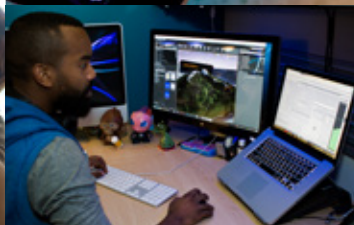

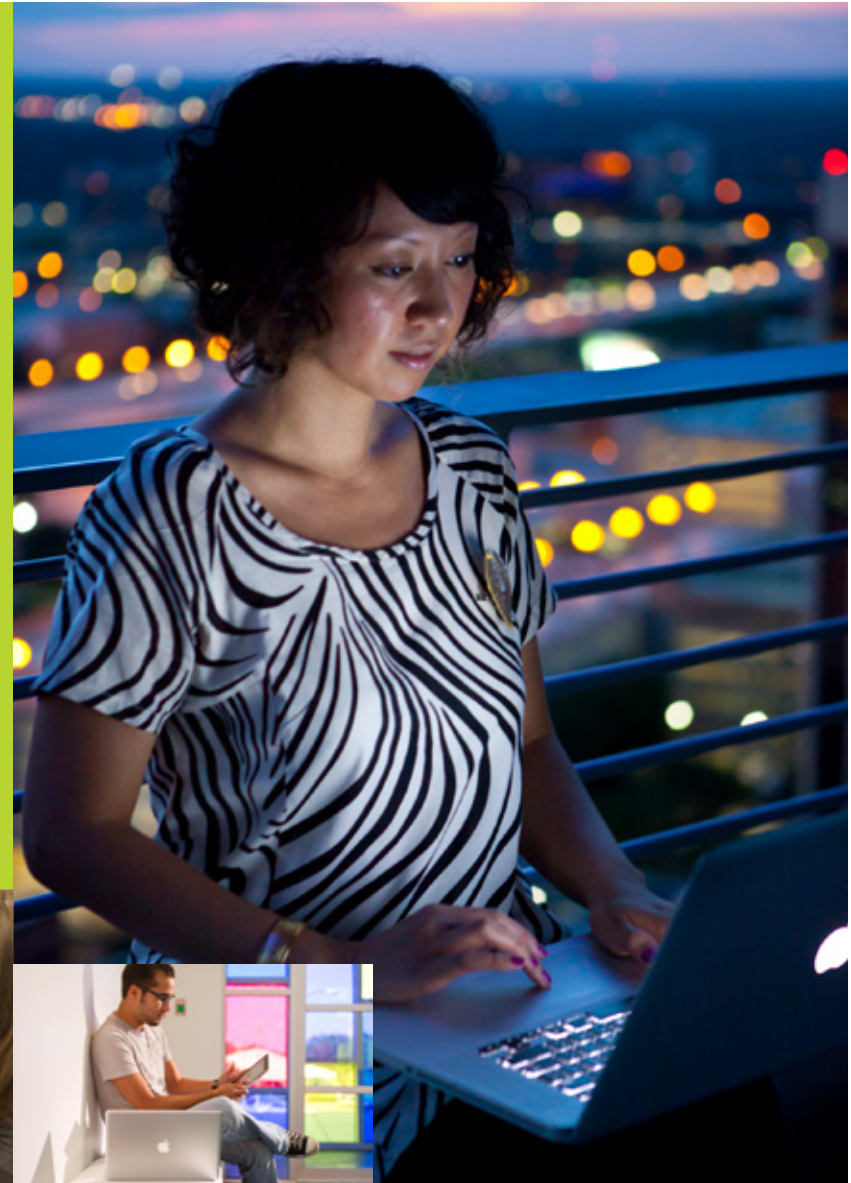
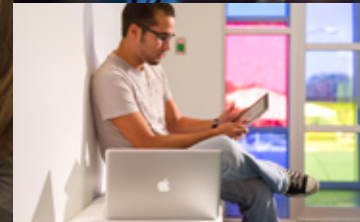
